john geoffrey lee always known as geoff joined the raf on his 20th birthday in june 1941 he left liverpool on a troop ship in december 1941 with no idea where he was going he eventually arrived in java where he was captured by the japanese along with many others during his time in captivity he survived several camps in java ambon and singapore and three hell ship journeys after being washed ashore in sumatra as a ferry he was being transported on blew up he was then recaptured and suffered sheer hell as a slave on the sumatra railway enduring bouts of malaria beri beri tropical ulcers and a starvation diet was bad enough but this was exacerbated by the searing heat and extreme cruelty meted out to the prisoners by the japanese and korean guards geoff miraculously survived weighing just 6 stone when he arrived back in liverpool in october 1945 after his release he found he had difficulty in convincing people where he had been as no one had heard of the sumatra railway only the other one thousands of miles away in burma letters to newspapers were returned as just another burma railway story the ministry of defence commonwealth war graves commission and the imperial war museum had no records of pow s building a railway in sumatra so began geoff s journey his aim to prove to the establishment what he already knew to be true this is geoff s story of his captivity release and subsequent efforts in achieving his aim

issued annually since 1946 47 the yearbook is the principal reference work of the united nations providing a comprehensive one volume account of the organization s work it includes details of united nations activities concerning trade industrial development natural resources food science and technology social development population environment human settlement children and legal questions along with information on the work of each specialized agency in the united nations family

unsure whether they would be greeted as traitors or heroes pows returning from vietnam responded by holding tight to their chosen motto return with honor we re giving the american people what they want and badly need heroes said a vietnam jungle pow i feel it s our responsibility our duty to help them where possible shed the idea this war was a waste useless as unpopular as it may have been in the first book to explore the entire range of memoirs biographies and group histories published since america s vietnam pows returned home craig howes explores the development of a collective history he describes how these captives drew upon their national heritage to compose a unified common story while still in prison and how individual pows have responded to this official story examining what racial cultural and political assumptions support this shared official story howes places the pows experiences squarely in the center of american history and within those larger clashes of opinion and belief which characterized the nation s response to the vietnam war the result is an engrossing study of what these captivity narratives can tell us about the pows their captors and america s vietnam legacy

joint winner of fraenkel prize for contemporary history 2001 london winner of talmon prize israel awarded by the israeli academy of sciences although it was one of the most common experiences of combatants in world war i captivity has received only a marginal place in the collective memory of the great war and has seemed unimportant compared with the experiences of soldiers on the western front yet this book focusing on pows on the eastern front reveals a different picture of the war and the human misery it produced during four years of fighting approximately 8 5 million soldiers were taken captive of whom nearly 2 8 million were austro hungarians this book is the first to consider in depth the experiences of these prisoners during their period of incarceration how were pows treated in russia what was the relationship between prisoners and their home state how were concepts of patriotism and loyalty employed and understood drawing extensively on original letters and diaries rachamimov answers these and other searching questions in the process major omissions in previous historiography are addressed anyone wishing to have a rounded history of the great war will find this book fills a major gap

on december 6 1941 ensign kazuo sakamaki was one of a handful of men selected to skipper midget subs on a suicide mission to breach pearl harbor s defenses when his equipment malfunctioned he couldn t find the entrance to the harbor he hit several reefs eventually splitting the sub and swam to shore some miles from pearl harbor in the early dawn of december was picked up on the beach by two japanese american mps on patrol sakamaki became prisoner no 1 of the pacific war japan s no surrender policy did not permit becoming a pow sakamaki and his fellow soldiers and sailors had been indoctrinated to choose between victory and a heroic death while his comrades had perished he had survived by becoming a prisoner of war sakamaki believed he had brought shame and dishonor on himself his family his community and his nation in effect relinquishing his citizenship sakamaki fell into despair and like so many japanese pows begged his captors to kill him based on the author s interviews with dozens of former japanese

pows along with memoirs only recently coming to light the anguish of surrender tells one of the great unknown stories of world war ii beginning with an examination of japan s prewar ultranationalist climate and the harsh code that precluded the possibility of capture the author investigates the circumstances of surrender and capture of men like sakamaki and their experiences in pow camps many pows ill and starving after days wandering in the jungles or hiding out in caves were astonished at the superior quality of food and medical treatment they received contrary to expectations most japanese pows psychologically unprepared to deal with interrogations provided information to their captors trained allied linguists especially japanese americans learned how to extract intelligence by treating the pows humanely allied intelligence personnel took advantage of lax japanese security precautions to gain extensive information from captured documents a few pows recognizing japan s certain defeat even assisted the allied war effort to shorten the war far larger numbers staged uprisings in an effort to commit suicide most sought to survive suffered mental anguish and feared what awaited them in their homeland these deeply human stories follow japanese prisoners through their camp experiences to their return to their welcoming families and reintegration into postwar society these stories are told here for the first time in english

many rural communities in south carolina share a place in world war ii history that has largely been forgotten from 1943 to 1946 towns such as aiken florence camden spartanburg and york were enthusiastic hosts for a special group of laborers german prisoners of war these prisoners from the north african sicilian and european campaigns filled needed jobs mostly in agriculture all across the nation in south carolina prison camps were established in rural areas where labor was needed in agriculture the lumber industry and a few manufacturing jobs prisoner labor was also used on military bases to free civilian and army personnel for front line duty by the end of w w ii over 425 000 german italian and japanese prisoners were interned in prisoner of war camps in the united states in south carolina the war department established more than twenty camps in seventeen counties housing 8 000 to 11 000 german prisoners these prisoners provided much needed labor in agricultural communities and were often the only direct connection with the enemy experienced on the home front prisoners of war and to analyze their implementation in south carolina from the perspectives of the american officials the german prisoners and the communities that housed the camps this book examines the history of prisoners of war in south carolina focusing on life behind the wire the labor performed by pows and the impact of this labor in south carolina the adherence to the geneva convention attitudes that influenced policies for the treatment of prisoners local reaction to the pows and their labor as well as the prisoners impressions of the conditions in which they were held
